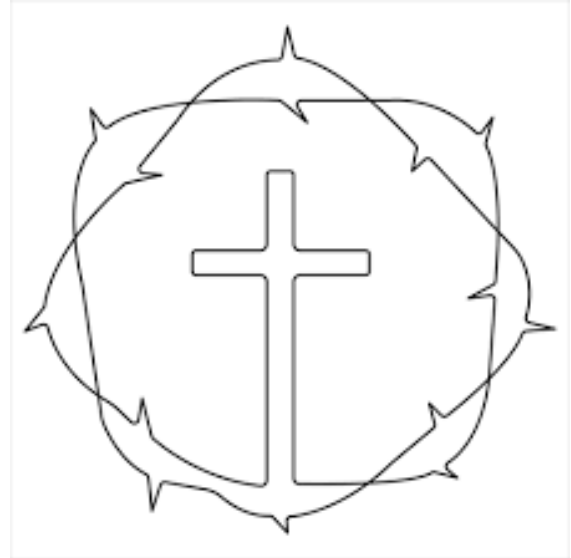

PROCESSION OF THE CROSS

*A wooden cross will be carried into the church by the Priest. At three points the Priest will pause and chant a versicle. All will respond by saying, **Come, Let us Worship**. Once at the altar the following prayers are said:*
