

The First Reading

☐ The First Reading is taken from Jeremiah, Chapter 31...

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

☐ The Second Reading is taken from Hebrews, Chapter 5...

Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek." In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

- D Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honor.

"Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—'Father, save me from this hour'? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again." The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

- P After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me." Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:
- @ Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.
- Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

Bio for Stephen L. Allen, Guest Organist

Stephen was born in Winston-Salem, North Carolina and studied organ in his senior year of high school at the North Carolina School of the Arts with John Muller. He studied organ at Mars Hill College in Mars Hill, NC with Donna Robertson and earned his BA in Organ Performance (with a double minor in Voice and Piano) at Warren Wilson College in Swannanoa, NC (outside of Asheville). He has done graduate organ study with John Brock at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. He was at Grace Covenant Presbyterian Church in Asheville before moving to Iceland to teach. Upon returning to the country, he worked briefly again in Asheville before moving to Fort Myers Beach to serve Chapel by the Sea Presbyterian Church as Director of Music/Organist.

Stephen has served churches in North Carolina, Tennessee, Florida and Olafsvik, Iceland. He has accompanied the Asheville Choral Society and the Southwest Florida Symphony Chorus. He is currently the Director of the Dunedin Community Chorus, directs Bay Voices (a TTBB men's choral ensemble) and performs with HeartStrings (a violin and piano ensemble with David Dusylovitch).

Stephen holds memberships in the Presbyterian Association of Musicians, Handbell Ringers of America, and the American Guild of Organists. He has served as Dean of AGO Chapters in North Carolina, Tennessee and Florida.

Stephen moved to Dunedin in 1989 to become Director of Music/Organist at First Presbyterian Church. Stephen "retired" in January of 2020 and now serves FPC on a part-time basis.
