When I moved to Dunedin and became a member of Good Shepherd in 2010, I couldn't help but notice that our day-to-day operations were heavily dependent on the church's Endowment Fund and if things didn't change, we would soon be in danger of exhausting the fund. Established in 1963, generous contributors have since donated about \$1M with the goal of supporting the church in difficult times. As with most endowments, funds are to be invested wisely and have a perpetual existence.

In 2011 disbursements from the Fund accounted for over 50% of the operating budget. To avoid further compromise of the Fund capital, the Endowment Fund Board initiated a more fiscally responsible spending policy, to which Vestry agreed. That action alerted church members that a combination of increased giving and reduced expenses would be required.

Since then, annual stewardship campaigns and cost reduction measures have been implemented. Each year we have been able to reduce our Endowment Fund dependency. As a result, Endowment Fund dependency for day-to-day operations has steadily declined from its high of 53% in 2011 to just 15% in 2018.

The combination of your increased giving, multifaceted endeavors to reduce expenses, and a determined Endowment Fund Board, have provided a winning formula for which we should all be proud.

Thank you, and if you ever have questions regarding our church financial status, please don't be afraid to ask. Our goal is to be

completely transparent and accountable with your donations.
